### **GOOD NEWS FROM MS. RICHARDS' SECOND GRADE CLASSROOM.**

Wow, time is truly flying by. It's hard to believe that half of the school year is over. We've accomplished a great deal.

In math, the students have been spending much time with the addition/subtraction of 2 digit numbers with regrouping. This is a challenging process. In subtraction, we begin with base ten blocks and model the exchange of a ten for ten ones on our work-mats. In so doing, the children physically move a "ten" from the ten's place, break it down into ones and add those to the one's place on their work-mat to simulate regrouping. We subtract the given amount to find the answer. Then we transfer that information to pencil paper. Addition is a similar process. Sound complicated? It truly is. And it is amazing that seven and eight year olds can grasp it. Eventually we move away from the manipulatives altogether until we are adding and subtracting with ease. Way to go second grade!!

Money and time are next. Please get out your pocket change and start counting. Let your child count out coins and purchase a small treat the next time you visit the grocery. Maybe you could even allow your child to keep your pocket change if he/she counts it correctly. See how many ways you can make money amounts. Have your child build Mom or Dad's age with coins. How many ways can you show 38 using pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters? Have fun! Make a game out of learning. Look for upcoming newsletters giving you more ideas for working with coins.

A big "thanks" goes out to Mrs. Rice who comes in weekly to help us play math games so that we can learn our math facts. We appreciate you!!

Reading is a blast. We use a tool called “task boards” to extend the meaning of our weekly stories. Task boards are based on Bloom’s Taxonomy of learning. Children choose a row on their task board. Each row contains three tasks (usually involving the writing process) with at least one item in that row requiring higher level thinking and reasoning. The children make connections to our stories and write songs, poems and friendly letters to/about our story characters. They retell story events from beginning to end and explore solutions to problems the characters are having. They complete Venn Diagrams, Story Maps, Comparison Charts and other graphic organizers. Children love the fact that they get to choose how to demonstrate their knowledge. I love it too!! You would be surprised to see what young children can do when given the freedom to soar. Ask your children about task boards.

Also thanks to our high school students Abbey and Isaac who read and do word work with some of my students. Their small group and individual assistance serves to foster further growth and development in reading. Thanks again to the students as well as their H.S. teacher Mrs. Lueth. Again, your help is appreciated.

Well, gotta go! Lesson plans to write and copies to run.

## CHANGES TO BCI AND FBI BACKGROUND CHECKS

All volunteers and coaches must have BCI and FBI background results on file at Wayne Local Schools. The Superintendent's Office has the capability to process these checks. The Superintendent's Office or building offices can tell you what results we currently have on file.

House Bill 1 has changed certain background check requirements for licensed educators in Ohio beginning Jan. 1, 2010:

- Educators who are **renewing** a license or permit and have lived continuously in the state of Ohio for the previous five years, *and* have a BCI background check on file **with ODE**, will need to complete *only* an FBI criminal background check once every five years. (Currently, they must complete both BCI and FBI checks whenever they renew.)
- Educators who **have not lived continuously in the state** for the past five years will need to complete both a BCI and FBI background check.
- Educators with **multiple licenses** only need to submit the required background checks when they are applying for the renewal of the license or permit that is of the *longest duration*.
- Educators who hold a **permanent certificate** are still required to submit the required background checks once every five years. Permanent certificate holders who have lived continuously in Ohio for those five years, however, will only need to submit FBI background checks.
- **Initial applicants** for a license must complete both BCI and FBI criminal background checks. These checks need to be less than 365 days old to be considered valid for licensing purposes.

Due to the changes for licensed educators we will make the same changes for our volunteers.

Volunteers and coaches must have a FBI criminal background check every five years. If there is a BCI results on our WLS database and you have lived continuously in the state the last 5 years you will not be required to redo your BCI background check just the FBI check. If you do not have any results on the WLS database or have not lived in the state the last 5 years you must complete both BCI and FBI checks.

\*Coaches or Aides that are applying for a Pupil Activity Supervisor Permit or an Educational Aide Permit must have a BCI background check on file with ODE.

The Superintendent's office will be open to do fingerprinting on TUESDAYS from 9:00 – 2:30. The cost for this service is: \$25 – BCI \$35 – FBI \$55 – Both

### SIMPLE TESTS OF EFFICIENCY

In your home, inefficiency can mean money is slipping through the cracks. Here are some tests you can perform to check the efficiency of a few items in your household.

- *To check for refrigerator/freezer leaks*, slip a piece of paper between the rubber gasket on your freezer and fridge doors and the frame. Close the door and tug on the paper. Do you notice any resistance? If not, the seal's not tight enough and cold air is probably leaking out, which means your fridge has to work harder to keep things cool. Be sure to try this on all four sides of the refrigerator and freezer doors.
- *To check for a leaky toilet tank*, pour food coloring into the water in the tank, wait two hours, then check to see if any color has seeped into the bowl. If it has the flapper in your tank is leaking, either from worn parts or mineral buildup. Be sure to flush down the dye (to avoid staining) before heading to the hardware store for a replacement flapper. Toilet leaks waste up to a gallon of water per minute. That's more than 43,000 gallons a month.
- *To check the efficiency of your shower*, place a 1-gallon bucket under the running showerhead and see how long it takes to fill the bucket. If it's less than 20 seconds, replace the showerhead with a low-flow head that sprays at least 1.5 gallons per minute. It could save you more than 14,600 gallons per year!
- *Check the temperature of your refrigerator* by sticking an appliance thermometer in a glass of water in the center of your refrigerator, or placing the thermometer between the frozen goods in the freezer overnight. The temperature of your refrigerator should be between 37 and 40 degrees F; your freezer between zero and 5 degrees. If you find that either compartment is too cold, adjust the setting – keeping them just 10 degrees colder than necessary can raise your energy consumption up to 25 percent.

### EVERYDAY ACTIONS TO STAY HEALTHY

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.

- Follow public health advice regarding school closures, avoiding crowds and other social distancing measures. These measures will continue to be important after a 2009 H1N1 vaccine is available because they can prevent the spread of other viruses that cause respiratory infections.
