### **MRS. FRANZ'S KINDERGARTEN**

The months have gone by so quickly. It's hard to believe the end of the school year is so near. We have been very busy completing the kindergarten curriculum and getting ready for first grade.

In a few weeks, we will begin our last set of assessments. The students will complete their final Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills, DIBELS, assessment on May 13<sup>th</sup>. On May 14<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> they will take their Developmental Reading Assessment, DRA. For this assessment students

are asked to read a new book and then retell the story. Graphs of the results from both assessments will be sent home with report cards at the end of the school year.

All kindergarten students will also complete an assessment packet where they will need to identify 175 sight words, identify the number of objects in sets of 1-30, identify all initial consonant and vowel sounds, identify rhyming pairs, and solve simple addition and subtraction problems using counters. In addition, they will need to identify numbers 1-30, all the uppercase and lowercase letters, 6 shapes, 5 solids (cylinder, cone, cube, pyramid, and sphere) and the coins (penny, nickel, dime, and quarter) and the value of these coins.

Along with all this hard work, we will have some fun. All kindergarten students will go to the Boonshoft Museum. The a.m. classes will go on Monday, May 24<sup>th</sup> and the p.m. and extended day classes will go on Tuesday, May 25<sup>th</sup>. If you are fingerprinted, we could use your help. Permission slips will be coming home soon. We have a field day planned for Tuesday, June 1<sup>st</sup>. We will have a great time competing against our grade level peers. The extended day class will compete with the pm classes. Please come and cheer us on. You do not have to be fingerprinted to watch. If you are fingerprinted, we would love to have your help. Finally, we will have our end of the year picnic on Wednesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>. We will eat our picnic during our pm snack time, so please send lunch money or pack your child's lunch as usual.

On Saturday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> from 2:00-5:00 Waynesville Elementary will have a Spring Carnival. We are in great need of parent volunteers for this event. Please contact me via email or send in a note in your child's communication folder if you are available to help.

I have truly enjoyed this school year and will treasure my memories of this class. Students please keep reading and writing and visit the library this summer.

## **4<sup>TH</sup> GRADE MATH**

The 4<sup>th</sup> grade students have been working diligently, preparing for the Ohio Achievement Assessments. In mathematics, we have reviewed the fourth grade standards, including:

Number, Number Sense & Operations

Measurement

Geometry and Spatial Sense

Patterns, Functions and Algebra

Data Analysis and Probability

The students recently studied a unit on customary and metric measurement including perimeter, area, and volume. For the remainder of the year, we will explore hands-on algebra, survey high school students and create graphs, and use number sense in many exciting projects. We will also explore mathematical brain teasers and web sites.

Every Friday, the 4<sup>th</sup> grade students take a two-minute timed multiplication test. They have been practicing these basic multiplication facts for six months, and it has been very exciting to monitor their progress and to see their confidence grow in many areas of math because they know these facts. The

### Lady Spartans Softball in comeback win over Carlisle!!!!

Varsity Softball had a good week. The Lady Spartans defeated Monroe on Tuesday 9-5 to run their record to 9-3. Hannah Morgan gave up 3 earned runs while striking out 8 batters. Offensively the Lady Spartans were led by freshman Leslie Turner, who was 2 for 2 with a double and a triple, while scoring 2 runs and 2 RBI's and a walk. Amber Bell also added 3 hits and 2 RBI's, and Nicole Lewis also had 2 hits and collected 2 RBI's. On Wednesday the Lady Spartans traveled to Madison to face a very good 12-2 team and lost 10-0 in 7 innings. Leslie Turner again led the offense with a 2 for 3 nights including another double. Thursday the Lady Spartans hosted Carlisle and what a game this was. Carlisle jumped ahead in the 1st inning 1-0, but the Lady Spartans put runners on base in the 1st inning but could not get a run across. The game went scoreless rest of the way until the 7th inning when Carlisle added an insurance run to make it 2-0 going into the final 3 outs of the game for Waynesville. Carlisle got 2 quick outs, but the Lady Spartans still had some spark left. Beth Cardona started the 2 out rally by reaching 1st base, followed by a hit from Brook Camery. With runners on 2nd and 3rd Katelyn Danner steps up to the plate and with a 1-2 count punches a ball into short right centerfield where the centerfielder could not make the play and 2 runs scored as Danner ended up at 3rd on a controversial call. With the score tied 2-2 and the winning run at 3rd, in steps senior Kayla Farra. On the first pitch Kayla rips a line drive into left field for a game winning hit and an amazing comeback by the Lady Spartans. The Lady Spartans host Madison today as the seniors close out their last game at home in their career. The Spartans will try to get back on track when they have a rematch vs. Madison on Friday night at Waynesville (7:30). This will also be senior night and will include the final home game for seniors Cory Young and Connor Kirby.

The Junior Varsity Baseball team has been growing well and now has a record of 9-6. The team has been led by Victor Boggs (.371 AVG), Caleb Keeton (.354), and Tyler Ledford (.333). ### Track team successful at home invitational!

Waynesville boys took second with 68.5 points in the Waynesville Invitational on Friday 4/23,

followed by Franklin (57), Greeneview (51) and Oakwood (41.5). Waynesville's 3,200 meter relay team of Matt Hussey, Andrew Valiquette, Stephen Jefferies and Joe Feldman turned in the top performance for the Spartans, winning the race in eight minutes, 32.33 seconds and breaking the school record by three seconds. Seth Millar recorded Waynesville's other first place finish, winning the 100 meters in a time of 11.11 seconds. The Spartans' 800 meter relay team (Seth Millar, Feldman, Joe Vagedes and Matt Lindsey) took second place with a time of 1:36.16. Also finishing second for Waynesville were Kevin Cornett in the discus (126 feet), Tyler Caplinger in the high jump (5-8), Feldman in the 400 meters (51.79 seconds) and Hussey in the 800 meters (2:04.55). Waynesville's girls finished fourth at the home invite with 50.6 points. Cincinnati Country Day won the meet with 91.6 points, followed by Fenwick (55) and Oakwood (54.6). Notable performances came from first place finisher Alyssa Ritchie in the 800m., and Jessica Dahnke in the discus. McKenna Warfel took 5th place in the shot put setting a personal record for the year.

The team will be at Franklin Friday, at Northridge on Tuesday and at Little Miami next Friday.

The middle school track team will be at home on Saturday, May 8th in the SWBL Championships at 10:00a.m.

I would like to thank all of the volunteers that help at each home track meet. It takes many volunteers at the finish line, each field event, bull pen and concession stand to make a successful meet and we are lucky to have great support from our parents and community members to help run our meets.

### INFORMATION FROM CINCINNATI CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL:

Nearly every school has several students with a nut or peanut allergy. To keep children safe, school

administrators often create nut or peanut-free zones in hope of avoiding a dangerous situation. Nurses and teachers are armed with life-saving injectable medicine in the event a child experiences anaphylactic shock after contact with the allergen.

- Peanut allergy now affects ~3 million children in the USA
- There is currently no approved treatment
- Early results involving peanut allergy desensitization offer hope for the treatment of food allergy
- Help us research food allergy, especially ways to desensitize children with known peanut allergy

Currently, there are no opportunities for children in the Ohio region to participate in these promising treatment trials. However, the food allergy clinic at Cincinnati Children's Hospital has the expertise to conduct food allergy desensitization trials and would like to be able to offer this option to children with these life-threatening allergies in our own region. The support of the community with participation and funds is needed to accomplish this goal.
