WHS STUDENT SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT

WHS Freshman Justin Stanley has attained significant achievement in the Southwest Ohio Motorcross Racing series. Justin has been riding motorcycles and quads since age five and has carried that love and passion over into an amateur motocross racing career. In his third year of racing in the series he has moved up from a 150cc class to a 250cc class and competes against many older teens as well as adults with many years of experience in this arena. Among Justin's many accomplishments to date, he has taken on a whole new attitude toward racing this year and has gone from double digit finishes in previous years to consistent single digit finishes in the 250C and 250 Open classes. Kohl's A minute for kids Newsletter - May 2010

HOW TO TELL WHEN A "BONK" ON THE HEAD MIGHT BE SERIOUS

When the baby takes a nose dive off the park bench, when your toddler runs into the door frame while playing hide and seek, when your teen takes a hard hit playing football – these are all situations requiring you to decide if a blow to the head warrants medical attention.

Laurence Kleiner, MD, director of neurosurgery at Dayton Children's, has seen many children come into Dayton Children's Regional Pediatric Trauma and Emergency Center with accidental head injuries. Whether the child has a concussion or just a bad "bonk," there are certain things parents can do to care for their child with a head injury.

"Most of the head injuries we see are not concussions, but we always check for certain symptoms and may keep a child for observation if he or she comes to the emergency department with a head injury," Dr. Kleiner explains.

NINE SYMPTOMS TO WATCH FOR

1. **Unusual sleepiness.** It is okay to let your child sleep, but be sure to check on your child every two to four hours for the first 12 hours after the injury. Your child should wake easily and act normally. (If your child acts normally when you wake him or her at night, it is okay to let the child go right back to sleep).
2. **Memory loss, confusion or trouble concentrating, or other changes in personality** such as becoming impulsive, reckless, aggressive or showing abnormal behavior
3. Increasing headache
4. **Stiff neck**
5. **Nausea or vomiting** (two or more times of vomiting in the 12 hours after the injury)
6. **Bleeding or clear drainage** from the nose or ears
7. **Trouble hearing**
8. **Dizziness, blurred or double vision** (children close one eye to try to correct this), unequal pupil size
9. **Weakness, numbness or tingling** of the arms and legs

These are all signs to call your child's doctor for follow-up care.

EVERYDAY ACTIONS TO STAY HEALTHY

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread that way.
- Stay home if you get sick, especially if you have a fever. CDC recommends that you stay home from work or school and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.
- Follow public health advice regarding school closures, avoiding crowds and other social distancing measures. These measures will continue to be important after a 2009 H1N1 vaccine is

available because they can prevent the spread of other viruses that cause respiratory infections.
