## **GOOD NEWS FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL ART**

Among the middle school exhibits will be a "debut" showing of our African American masks. They are authentic in design which we will see later at the Cincinnati Art Museum. Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade trip will be postponed until the beginning of next year. The students will go at the beginning of their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year.

Sixth grade is carving Chinese terra-cotta soldiers. We will make prints which will complement our Asian art. Our last unit was about color, ending in warm/cool woven portraits. They will not be on display but can be easily seen in the middle school hallway.

### **Boys Tennis SWBL Champions!**

The Spartan Boys Tennis team took a 6 point lead into the SWBL Tourney on Thursday and not only won but increased their margin of victory. The Team had all five spots in the finals of the tournament. Mitch Chamberlain at First singles finished second to Alex Fields from Madison who went undefeated in league play this season. At Second singles Ben Chamberlain defended his crown winning and now has gone undefeated in league play the past two years. At Third singles Spencer Zate won for the second year in a row also.

First Doubles was played by Matt Unger and Andy Hoeweler and they finished second by losing a third set tiebreaker to a Monroe team that was a sectional finalist last year.

At second doubles Dr. Taylor Bayes and Caleb Liles went into the tournament as a third seed and in their first match they upset Monroe in a match that went 3 hours. They returned in the next round and defeated Madison in another 3 hour match and finally lost to #1 seed Carlisle on an empty tank after the first two matches. A special thanks goes out to Scott Camery for announcing the game and festivities. On Monday, the Lady Spartans traveled to Monroe to finish out league play. They came away with another league win by a score of 15-11. Wednesday the team was defeated at Little Miami by a score of 8-0. The team will travel to Franklin today to close out the regular season. The Lady Spartans received the #2 seed in the tournament drawing and will host Blanchester at home on Wednesday, May 12, at 5:00. Since it is a tournament game, admission will be charged at the gate. Good luck to the Lady Spartans as they approach tournament play.

The Girls will open up Tournament play at Home next Wednesday May 12<sup>th</sup> at 5:00. Admission will be \$5 to get in. Also the game will be on WYNS 89.3 and Spartanslive.com.

The Boys Tournament game will be on Monday May 10<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 vs Clinton Massie. Once again there will be an admission charge of \$5.

### **Baseball Team finishes Third!**

The Waynesville Baseball Team has one game remaining on their schedule and then will begin their tournament push against Massie on 5/10 (5:00 @ Waynesville). The Spartans have finished 4th in the

SWBL with a 6-6 record and currently stand 13-13 overall. The Spartan attack has been led by solid defense this year including outfielders Conner Kirby, Cory Young, Joe Tweel, Tyler Kilby, Nate McGillivray, and Shaun Lewis. The infield has also been solid with Kevin Carter, Tyler Schrock, Trent Fruhwirth, Ty Black, and Conner Combs. The catching position has also improved dramatically with Max Ramsey and Gade Abrams doing the duty behind the plate. The defense has also been helped by a pitching staff that has obtained a 3.36 ERA led by Cory Young, Joe Tweel, Kevin Carter, Tyler Schrock, Shaun Lewis, and Trent Fruhwirth. The Spartans hope their success this season will lead to a run at the sectional title starting on Monday vs. their rival Clinton Massie. The winner will then go on to play Dixie on Wednesday.

### **Track gearing up for SWBL!**

The Waynesville Varsity boys and girls track teams took home 3<sup>rd</sup> place honors in the Franklin "Bart Owens" Invitational on Friday 4/30/10.

Standout performances came from 1<sup>st</sup> place Jessica Dahnke in the discus with a throw of 126'-3" (setting a new school record), and 1<sup>st</sup> place Seth Millar in the 100m. with a time of 10.98 (setting a new school record).

Other first place finishers came from the girls' 4x800m (Crossgrove, Patterson, Muterspaw, Millar) with a combined time of 11:00, the boys' 4x100m and 4x200m (Millar, Lindsey, Feldmann, Vagedes) at 45.3 and 1:35.2, and Joe Feldmann in the 400m. with 52.1.

Second place finishers on the girls' side were Jessica Dahnke in the shot put with 33' Alyssa Ritchie in the 100m. and 400m. with times of 13.5 and 64.5, Jerusha Crossgrove in the 1600m. with 6:03, the 4x100m (Adams, Patterson, Painter, Dyer) with a time of 54.8, and the 4x4 (Dyer, Patterson, Millar, Crossgrove) at 4:30.

Second place finishers on the boys' side included the boys 4x800 (Hussey, Valiquette, Wells, Jefferies) at 8:45.

Third place finishers were the girls 4x200m. (Messer, Dyer, Patterson, Ritchie) with a time of 1:56, Mollie Muterspaw in the 3200m. at 13:46, Matt Hussey in the 800m. with 2:06, Cade Lowing in the 3200m. with 11:09, and Kevin Cornett in the discus with a throw of 125'-11".

NATIONAL WOMEN'S HEALTH WEEK: May 9-15

National Women's Health Week is a weeklong health observance coordinated by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Office on Women's Health. National Women's Health Week empowers women to make their health a top priority. With the theme "It's Your Time," the nationwide initiative encourages women to take simple steps for a longer, healthier, and happier life. Women are often the caregivers for others and forget to focus on their own health. But research shows that when women take care of themselves the health of their family improves as well. National Women's Health week is a time when we can remind women about steps they can take to improve their physical and mental health and lower their risks of certain diseases. Important steps include:

- Getting at least 2 hours and 30 minutes of moderate physical activity, 1 hour and 15 minutes of vigorous physical activity or a combination of both each week.
- Eating a nutritious diet.
- Visiting a health care professional to receive regular check ups and preventative screenings.
- Avoiding risky behaviors, such as smoking and not wearing a seatbelt.
- Paying attention to mental health, including getting enough sleep and managing stress.

## INFORMATION FROM CINCINNATI CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL:

Nearly every school has several students with a nut or peanut allergy. To keep children safe, school administrators often create nut or peanut-free zones in hope of avoiding a dangerous situation. Nurses and teachers are armed with life-saving injectable medicine in the event a child experiences anaphylactic shock after contact with the allergen.

- Peanut allergy now affects ~3 million children in the USA
- There is currently no approved treatment
- Early results involving peanut allergy desensitization offer hope for the treatment of food allergy
- Help us research food allergy, especially ways to desensitize children with known peanut allergy

Currently, there are no opportunities for children in the Ohio region to participate in these promising treatment trials. However, the food allergy clinic at Cincinnati Children's Hospital has the expertise to conduct food allergy desensitization trials and would like to be able to offer this option to children with these life-threatening allergies in our own region. The support of the community with participation and funds is needed to accomplish this goal.
