Water. Children need the opportunity to drink water throughout the day. Students who are well-hydrated are more friendly, well-reasoned, attentive, and coherent. A mere 2% drop in body water can trigger fuzzy short-term memory and decreased focusing ability. The brain dehydrates every 20 minutes. If access to water is restricted, the stress response can kick in. Within 5 minutes of consuming water, there is a marked decline in the stress hormone cortisol. **General rule of thumb:** drink one cup of water per hour for optimal brain functioning.

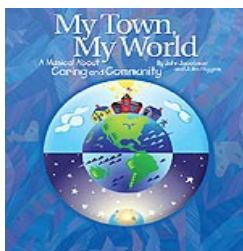
