The **Ohio Department of Education** each year releases a report card for each school district in the state, with scores and ratings on many factors. Overall we did well on the report card; however we need time to analyze all of the data. A quick look at a few of **Wayne Local's** District Grade Card highlights:

Wayne Local is Top 10% in the entire state of Ohio in the **Achievement Component** based on overall scores on state tests. Performance index is weighted 75 percent, and "indicators met" is the other 25 percent.

Performance index: A subset of Achievement, this is the most detailed measure of state test performance. It goes deeper than just a "yes or no" on proficiency, giving more credit for the highest performers and less credit for lowest scorers to create an overall score

Wayne Local has the 8th highest performance index percent in the entire Miami Valley area and 2nd highest in Warren County:

Progress: Judges whether students made one year’s worth of academic growth from last school year. One year of growth equals a "C" grade. Generally, it is based on what statewide percentile students score in each year.

The **Progress Grade** combined with a secondary component of performance index ranks **Wayne Local** number 3 in the Miami Valley

The **K-3 Literacy Improvement Grade: Waynesville** was the region’s top performer in K-3 Literacy Improvement on the report card. K-3 Literacy measures what percentage of a district’s struggling readers get back on track to proficiency between kindergarten and third grade. Waynesville had the third best score in the state on that measure, at 88 percent.
