Number of incidents that resulted in formal discipline- 0 incidents resulted in formal discipline.

Types of disciplinary action taken: 3 - Office Lunch Interventions, In-school intervention, conferences with parents/students, and restorative practice conversations between students

Steps to prevent and reduce incidents of bullying, harassment, and intimidation

- Provide information and resources to students and parents via the school webpage, including the Bullying Flow Chart
- Utilize positive our CORE values system: Focus on building positive school culture through values-based lessons delivered by counselor and administrators
- Refer students to guidance counselor for working on peer relationships
- Contact Transportation to move student's seat on bus and make driver aware of situation
- Work with Classroom Teacher and Guidance Counselor to adjust schedule to separate students
- Conference in person, over the phone, and through emails with parents
- Recommendations made for students to talk to counselor or seek outside counseling
- Use bulletin boards and school announcements to promote anti-bullying message
