## JUVENILE COURT'S YOUTH COURT SEEKING HIGH SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS

Warren County Juvenile Court has volunteer opportunities available for any high school student who lives in Warren County - - grades $9^{\text {th }}$ through $12^{\text {th }}$ - - who is interested in participating in its Youth Court Program. The volunteers will be a part of actual court hearings by serving in the roles of judge, bailiff, prosecuting attorney, defense attorney, and jurors. Local attorneys and law students from nearby law schools will mentor the youth attorneys when available.

All cases referred to Youth Court will involve youth facing misdemeanor charges in which the youth has admitted to the charge and agreed to have the Youth Court decide the appropriate sanctions or disposition. Both sides will present their cases and the jury will deliberate to decide what sanction the youth will receive. If the youth successfully completes the terms of the sanctions rendered by the youth jury, the charge against him or her will be dismissed.

Youth Court hearings will be tentatively set on the $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ Thursday of each month beginning in the Fall, 2021. Perhaps your school will allow your time spent in Youth Court to count as your community service hours requirement. Applications can be accessed on the Juvenile Court website at:
